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# BETWEEN MORALITY AND RELIGIOUS TOLERANCE: MORAL FOUNDATIONS AND RELIGIOUS TOLERANCE AMONG INDONESIANS

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## Abstract

The rise to the idea of pluralism has raised questions on the possibility of coexisting. However, the reality in which religious groups are consistently having conflicts between one another indicates that the idea of peaceful coexistence between religious people as a nonsensical idea. Religious tolerance has been found to be a good solution to the religious conflicts happening in the world. However, where religion is concerned, so does values, and thus morality. Moral foundations as a psychological construct help explain how an individual views what is right and wrong. This research aims to study the relationship between moral foundations and religious tolerance. Result shows that the moral foundations of fairness-cheating ( $p < 0.05$ ) is able to positively predict religious tolerance and the foundations of authority-subversion ( $p < 0.05$ ) and sanctity-degradation ( $p < 0.05$ ) are able to negatively predict levels of religious tolerance. Limitations were found and recommendations were made.
