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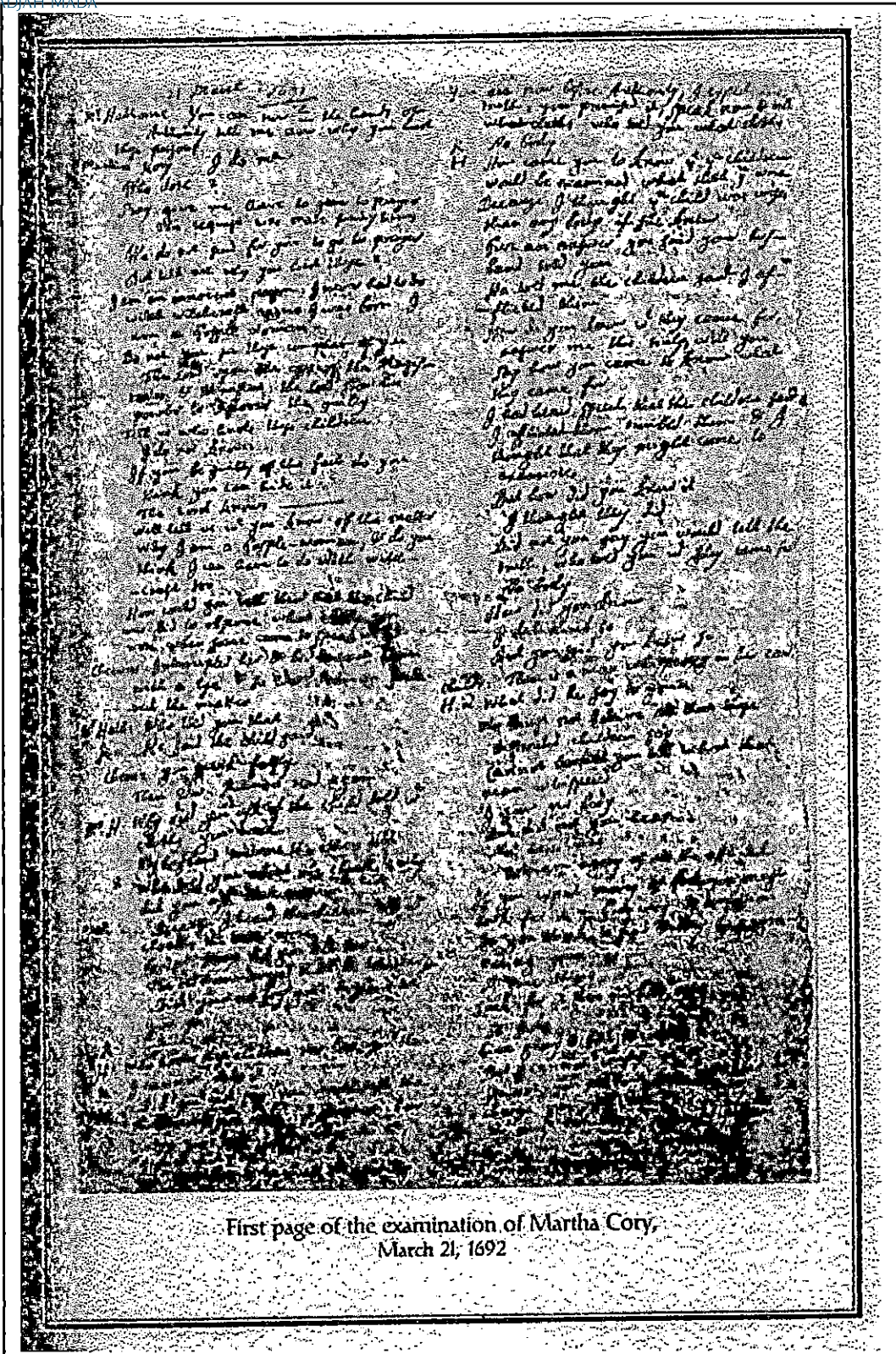
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Bridget Bishop's death warrant,

The humble petition of Mary Easty, a
 Judge and Bench, now sitting in the Court of
 and the Reverend Ministers humbly sheweth
 that whereas your poor and humble Petitioner being con-
 demned to die for humbly begs of you to make into your
 gracious and good considerations that your poor and humble
 petitioner knowing my own innocence please to the Lord for
 me and seeing for my wife and children and others by my
 self can not but judge charitably of others that are going
 the same way of my self if the Lord beys not mightily in
 conscience a man of my self and whole people upon the same
 certain that that condemned now for and then cleared by
 afflicted persons as some of your honours know none
 condemned two ages since was cryed out upon by them and
 have been confused and now are condemned to die the Lord
 have known my innocence then and likewise does know
 that on the great day will be known to men and Angels
 in question to your honours not for my own life for
 I know I must die and my appointed time is set but the
 Lord he knows it is that if it be possible no more can
 my blood may be shed which undoubtedly cannot be
 shayed for the day and course you go in I question not
 but your honours does to the utmost of your powers
 in the discovery and detection of witchcraft and witches
 and would not be guilty of innocent blood for the
 words but by my own innocence know you are in
 the wrong way the Lord in his infinite mercy direct
 you in this great work if it be his blessed will that
 innocent blood be not shed I would humbly beg of you that
 your honours would be pleased to examine these afflicted
 persons closely and keepe them away some time and
 likewise to try some of those confessing articles I bring
 considered there is some of them has belged themselves
 and others as will appeare if not in this world I am sure
 in the world to come whether you now going and I question
 not you will see an alteration of these things the I say my
 self and others having made league with the Devil
 cannot confesse I know and the Lord knows as
 will for thereby appeare they helpe me and I question not
 but they are others the Lord knows who is the searcher of
 all hearts knows that as I shall answer it at the
