

**POSITION INFORMED *CONSENT* IN IMPLEMENTATION
ADVANCED *DIRECTIVES* IN CASES OF CARDIAC ARREST
PATIENTS FOR MEDICAL PERSONNEL CARRYING OUT
ACTIONS *DO NOT RESUSCITATE***

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ABSTRACT

The purpose of this research is to find out and examine the implementation of giving *consent advanced directives* in cardiac arrest patients undergoing surgery *do not resuscitate* and to find out the implications of giving *consent do not resuscitate* which is done based on *advanced directives* as legal protection for medical personnel.

This research is descriptive in nature with an empirical normative type. Normative research is carried out through library research on various legal materials, both primary and secondary to obtain secondary data through document study. Empirical research was carried out to obtain primary data through field research by interviewing research subjects using interview guides. Data obtained from literature and field research were analysed qualitatively. The data results are presented descriptively analytically.

Based on the results of the research and discussion, it can be concluded that first, patients who experience cardiac arrest express the desire for medical treatment to be carried out on them *verbally* to the family. Realization *informed consent* Based on Hospital "A" procedures, it is given to the patient's family. Second, the legal implications of the gift *informed consent* to cardiac arrest patients based on *verbal advanced directives* for medical personnel who carry out procedures *do not resuscitate*. *It is* not an unlawful act because the action taken is the patient's wish.
