

7. Limitation and Strength of the Study

The main limitation of this study is that only social security agency policies were included. We recognize that the policies of other institutions will have considerable ramifications on prevention and occupational health and safety issues; however, the scope of this study was limited in the extent to the assistance of promotional and prevention programs by BPJS Ketenagakerjaan in order to specifically assess the problematizations underpin in that policy area. A major strength of the study is that it included a detailed strategy of OHS promotion and prevention policies in the social security context obtain from government regulations and its derivatives.
